## **Our Mission**

## Long Term policy vision

## 118th Congress policy requests

#### Cannabis

- Include prisoner resentencing and release in any cannabis legalization bill.
- Descheduling, not rescheduling of cannabis.

#### **Psychedelics**

- Repeal the Rave act
- Co-sponsor the Psychedelic Breakthroughs Act.
  - Add LSD to the Breakthrough Therapies Act.

#### Harm reduction

- Repeal ban on individuals convicted of a felony from accessing SNAP or other benefits.
- Send a letter encouraging the Department of Education to affirm that the Drug Free Schools and Communities Act(DFSCA) does not prevent college campuses from implementing harm reduction programs or reducing university penalties for substance use.
